





Divine Might by Natalie Haynes

A female-centered look at Olympus and the Furies, focusing on the goddesses whose prowess, passions, jealousies, and desires rival those of their male kin.




Soundtrack of Silence by Matt Hav

An inspiring memoir about a young man who discovered he was going completely deaf just as he found love for the first time. Before that happened, he planned to commit his favorite songs to memory.




The Ascent by Adam Plantinga

When a high security Missouri prison fails and releases violent criminals, a down-on-his luck police officer and the governor's daughter must team up to take on the most dangerous convicts in the state.




The Gardins of Edin by Rosey Lee

When the bonds in their family begin to fray, four Black women fight to preserve their legacy, heal their wounds, and find peace by holding onto each other.




Deep Freeze by Michael Grumley


Family Family by Laurie Frankel

The author of *This Is* How It Always Is returns with a heartwarming and provocative tale about adoptive parenting and what it truly means to be a family.




Mrs. Quinn's Rise to Fame by Olivia Ford

When she earns a spot on a popular British baking show, Jenny's newfound fame uncovers old secrets.




Wandering Stars by Tommy Orange


<u>Bride</u> by Ali Hazelwood


Anita de Monte Laughs Last by Xochitl Gonzalez

As Raquel struggles to fit between two worlds, she finds her life mirrored in artist Anita de Monte's, a woman who mysteriously died over a decade before.




The Warm Hands of Ghosts by Katherine Arden


The Great Divide by Cristina Henriquez

An epic novel of the construction of the Panama Canal, casting light on the unsung people who lived, loved, and labored there.




The Last Days of the Midnight Ramblers by Sarah Tomlinson


<u>2054</u> by Elliot Ackerman

After a political assassination sends the US into a new kind of civil war, a group of elite actors find themselves hunting down the tech visionary that predicted this fallout.




One Moment by Becky Hunter

After Scarlett's death, she finds herself observing the aftermath as those she left behind struggle to deal with their loss.




A History of the World in Twelve Shipwrecks by David Gibbins

In this paradigm-shifting memoir, Lyn Slater tells her story of how she found fame in her sixties, showing people a unique perspective on what it means to be "old."




All We Were Promised by Ashton Lattimore


The Best Way to Bury Your Husband by Alexia Casale

Through an unconventional self-help group, four women come together as they heal from the damage their husbands caused... and try to get away with their murders.




The Murder of Mr. Ma by SJ Rozan

Sherlock Holmes in this imaginative thriller about two unlikely allies racing through the cobbled streets of 1920s London in search of a killer.




<u>How to Solve Your Own</u> <u>Murder by Kristen Perrin</u>

Frances has spent her life trying to prevent her foretold murder only to succumb to her fate sixty years later. Now her great-niece must catch the killer without meeting the same demise.




The Titanic Survivors Book Club by Timothy Schaffert


<u>The Familiar</u> by Leah Bardugo

Luzia is a lowly kitchen servant until her magical gifts plunge her into a world of holy men and hucksters, and she is caught up in a fight for the Spanish throne.




<u>Days of Wonder</u> by Caroline Leavitt


<u>Ghost Station</u> by SA Barnes

A space exploration crew tries to survive on an abandoned planet but when their pilot is gruesomely murdered, the psychologist sent to help them discovers something far more sinister.




Your Presence is Mandatory by Sasha Vasilyuk

Ukraine 2007. Yefim Shulman is a World War II veteran with a secret that could land him in the Gulag, and his family who is forced to live in the shadow of his deception.




<u>The Fellowship of</u> <u>Puzzlemakers</u> by Samuel Burr


The Roads We Follow by Nicole Deese
