A Business insurance can help protect against property damage, liability, and more. Each business is unique so it is important to **investigate specialty insurance policies for your particular business.**

Q What are my options for funding?

A • **Grants:** A government grant is a financial award given by the federal, state, or local government for a beneficial project. The grantee is not expected to repay the money.

• **Bootstrapping:** Use savings, credit cards, home equity loan, or borrowed money from friends & family.

• **Banks:** Local banks can work with you to secure a commercial loan.

• **SBA:** The Small Business Administration does not give out loans; rather, they provide loan guarantees to banks to encourage the funding of small businesses.

Patent

Protects the inventor by conferring the right to "exclude others from making, using, offering for sale, or selling" the registered invention within the US.

Any word, name, symbol, device, or combination thereof used to identify and distinguish the goods of one manufacturer to another.

Copyright

Protects original works of authorship fixed in a tangible medium of expression, such as writing, music, photos, and more.

Q What if I need to hire employees?

Select a Legal Structure

Before you register your business, you must determine your: **LEGAL OWNERSHIP STRUCTURE.**



SOLE PROPRIETORSHIP

One owner.
Personal liability for debts.
Not taxed as an entity.



PARTNERSHIP

Two or more partners.
Personal liability for debts.
Not taxed as an entity.



LIMITED LIABILITY CO. (LLC)

One or more members.
Limited liability for debts.
(Business separate from Personal)
Must file with MD Dept. of Taxation.



CORPORATION

One or more shareholders.
Limited liability for debts.
Managed by directors elected by shareholders.
Must file with MD Dept. of Taxation.

An EIN (**Employer Identification Number**) is obtained from the IRS.

Also known as: Federal Tax ID Number or Tax Identification Number (TIN)

Uses Business bank accounts, hiring employees, tax reporting
