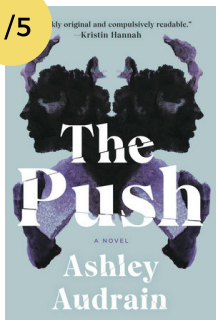

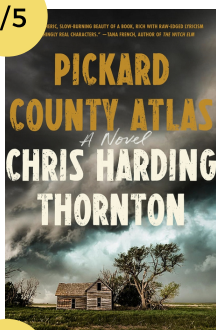


THE PUSH

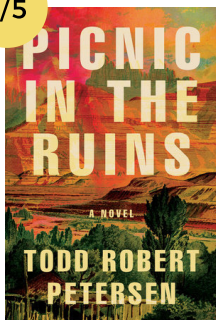


PICKARD COUNTY ATLAS

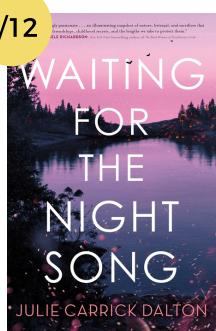


NIGHT BIRD CALLING

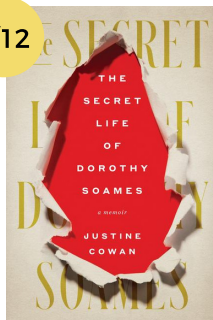


WAITING FOR THE NIGHT SONG

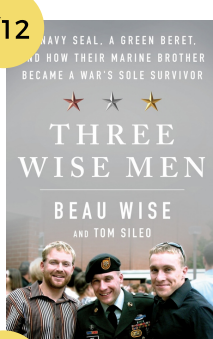

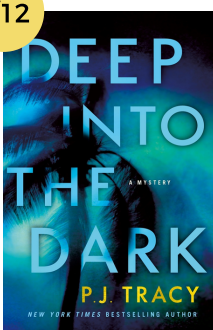


THE CHILDREN'S BLIZZARD

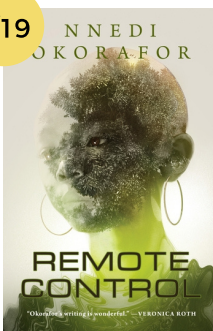


DEEP INTO THE DARK

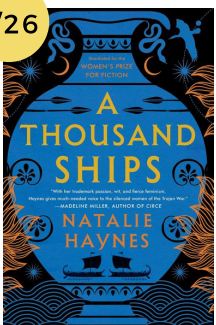


THE NATURE OF FRAGILE THINGS

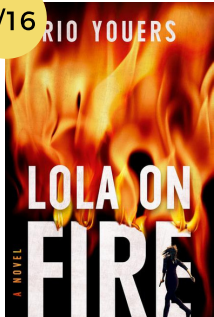


HONEY GIRL

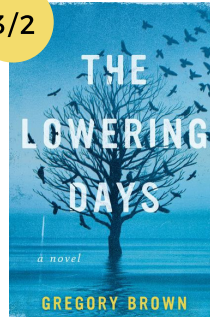

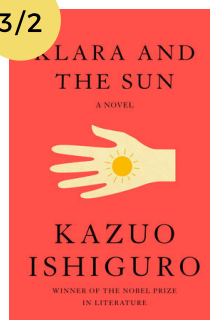


THE SMASH-UP

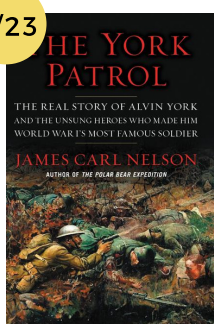


KLARA AND THE SUN

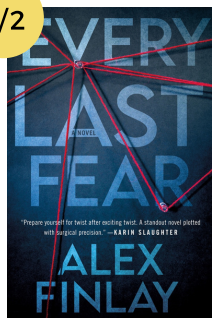


THE LOST APOTHECARY

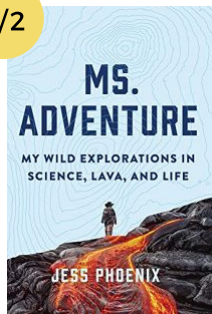


EVERY LAST FEAR

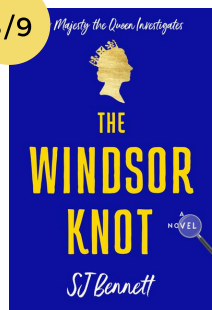


MS. ADVENTURE

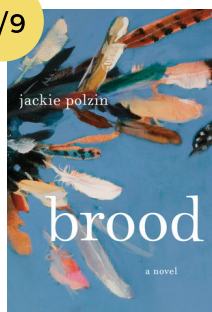


THE WINDSOR KNOT

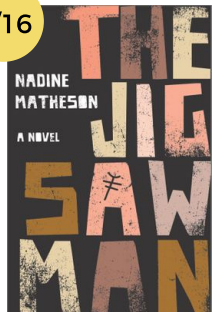


BROOD

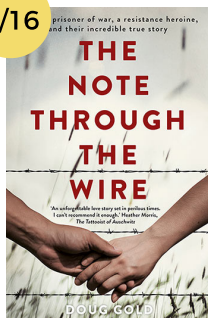


THE JIGSAW MAN

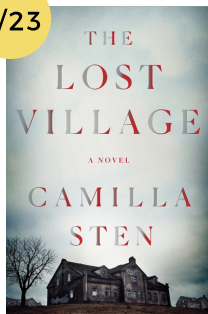


THE NOTE THROUGH THE WIRE

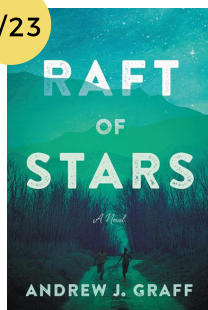


THE LOST VILLAGE

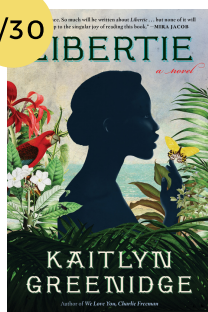


RAFT OF STARS

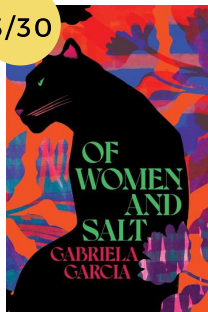


LIBERTIE
