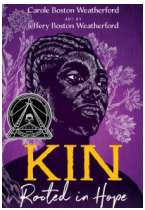


NOVEMBER EVENTS FOR TEENS & ADULTS AT ELKTON

Meet fellow anime and manga enthusiasts and discuss your favorites. Read, watch, and enjoy anime-themed activities. Grades 6-12.

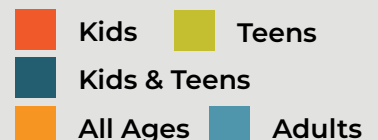
Tween Academy: Feathers and Contaminates with Tri-State Bird Rescue Mon, 11/24 at 1pm
